RESOLUTION

WHEREAS on August 26, 2006, pursuant to the authority granted by Section 10 of Chapter 263 of the New York State Laws of 1981, the electors of Cuba Lake adopted Land Use Restrictions and Controls; and

WHEREAS Section 13.2 of the Land Use Restrictions and Controls provides among other things for there to be established reasonable monetary penalties for non-compliance in such amounts as may from time to time be approved by resolution of the Cuba Lake District Commissioners.

NOW THEREFORE, it is resolved that the following monetary penalties be and hereby are established as the Cuba Lake Land Use Restrictions and Control penalties for non-compliance:

- 1) Failure to comply with a stop work order, issued for violation of the Land Use Restrictions and Controls, is subject to a penalty at a sum as may be fixed by the Cuba Lake District up to a maximum of one hundred dollars (\$100) per day.
- 2) In the event construction has been undertaken without first having obtained a required permit or where work is performed which is not in substantial compliance with the issued permit, the Board of Commissioners may require the Lease Holder or Lot Owner to elect one of the following options:

- a) To abate the violation by its removal at the property owners expense, or
- b) If the leaseholder so requests, and if the Board of Commissioners determines the grant of a permit for such construction would be otherwise authorized, the leaseholder/Lot Owner may be ordered to pay a penalty to the Cuba Lake District as may be fixed by the Cuba Lake District up to a maximum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00).
- 3) In the event a variance proceeding under Section 11 of the Land Use Restrictions and Controls has been held which results in the Cuba Lake Commission ordering compliance and upon failure to comply with said order the Lease Holder may be required to submit payment of a penalty at a sum as may be affixed by the Cuba Lake District up to a maximum of a \$100 per day of non-compliance measured from the day of the failure to comply.
- 4) Prior to the fixing of any penalty, the Cuba Lake Commission shall have a hearing. The hearing shall be public with prior written notice of at least 30 days. Such proceeding shall permit the property owner to attend and to speak to the matter that is subject to non-compliance. The Commissioners shall thereupon vote upon the proposed fine or modify the fine or reject the fine by Board action.
- 5) Any fine fixed shall be payable within thirty (30) days and thereafter shall accrue interest at the annual rate of nine percent (9%) per year compounded daily during the period of time it is unpaid. Outstanding amounts beyond 30 days and associated interest will be invoiced as part of the property tax invoice issued by the Town/County. The Cuba Lake Commission may collect the fines as permitted by law including, without limitation, as an addition to annual lease payments. Non-payment shall be grounds for non-renewal of a lease or by remedies associated with failure to pay taxes.

Resolution is hereby adopted this 14th day of June, 2007.

Lake Manager's Report:

Mallard Farms had a manure spill on 6/5/07 and 6/6/07. On Tuesday emergency overflow (run off water) was being drained from the catch basin. At approximately 3am a pipe broke emptying liquid manure into the basin and consequently into Rawson Creek. Wednesday, the spill was discovered and corrective measures were made which consisted of pumping water and liquid manure out of the creek and into a field. The flow at the stream was stopped and controlled so that little if any manure reached the lake. DEC officer Hanson, Commissioner Dave Shemeld and Dave Bosworth confirmed this along with a call from the Division of Waters in Buffalo, Gerry Palumbo.

On 6/8/07, Dave Bosworth called Mr. Palumbo and found that approximately 40 to 75 thousand gallons of manure was emptied into Rawson Creek. Dave called Gerry Palumbo and asked what will the farm be fined? How much will they be fined? Will the farm be required to install alarms? What will be done to insure that this will not happen again? The answer to all these questions is yet to be determined. Dave made the suggestion to Mr. Palumbo that a STIFF fine be levied as well as an order from DEC to install an alarm system to indicate a loss of pressure on any line carrying liquid manure. Charlie Bare/Mallard Farms left a message on 6/14/07 saying that DEC had tested Rawson Creek below the spill and found that the oxygen levels were excellent. Pumping the creek was stopped.

Conveyance of Smith Rd. right of way to Tom Rhow has been stopped for the moment. Research on property lines and ownership is being conducted. Dave Roeske, Allegany County Highways Department, will keep Dave informed. Dave has petitioned him to transfer a right of way to the District or to keep the right of way available to the public and for the sewer line.

After some minor repairs to the weed harvester and elevator both are ready for summer use. With the exceptionally clear water and warm temperatures we expect a healthy crop. The harvester was launched on 6/14/07.

With the help of the CRCS Agriculture Class, we have successfully planted over 1000 trees and shrubs at the sediment basins and at public access areas.

After a review of the viewshed from lot 344, my finding was that the large arborvitae on lot 345 does in fact diminish the view but the problem is that they were planted before the building at 344 was built. The newly planted trees on lot 343 do very little to limit the view but they are of the variety of tree that will get bigger and after some time substantially limit the view from 344.

After noticing many dead and dying small fish in the lake Joe Evans DEC fish biologist was contacted. He had noticed the same and noted that it did not appear to be a wide spread fish kill but possibly a virus affecting a certain species (crappie). He asked Dave to capture a dying fish, kill it, ice it down and bring it to the DEC office to be tested in their lab. On 6/13/07 Jay Morris brought a fish that was dying and Dave according to instructions took the fish to DEC on 6/14/07.
